A Letter from your Clergy.

Special times, days and anniversaries of events are very important to us. In the church we are half way through Lent which started on St. Valentine's Day, which brought about the first cultural collision on our 2018 calendar. Ash Wednesday, the day after Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day, is a day of ash smudged heads and fasting. Valentines day is a commercial occasion based on romantic ideas of love. The sentiments for the day seem to be at odds.

The two most important dates in the churches year are Christmas Day and Easter Day. Easter Day this year falls April 1st "All Fool's Day." This is for me the anniversary of the death of my mother in 1991. My father passed away the day before on the 31st March 1991, which happened to be Easter Sunday.

Easter day is a movable feast. The date of Easter can be found using a formula in the prayer book and there we can refer to the Table of Moveable Feasts. Here we discover that every eleven years an anniversary date falls on the same calendar date. From 1991 the year my parents passed away, the anniversary dates were 2002 & 2013, the next one is 2024.

As I write this letter I confess to finding it hard that my mother did not die on Easter Sunday. It was my mother, who nurtured me in the faith, who died on "All Fools Day" Easter Monday. It was my father, a searcher of faith throughout his life, who died on Easter Sunday morning, the day of Resurrection. It somehow did not settle with me and never has until now with a second calendar clash of 2018 when Easter day is on All Fools Day.

At the end of this month we are about to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, when we meet in our churches on Easter day, the 1st April, the anniversary of my Mothers passing. This year I am reminded that every day is a good day to die. There is no choice given. It is In God's Perfect Time that we will take our place with Jesus who died for us on Good Friday. Let us Celebrate Christ's Rising in Glory with real fervour this year remembering all those we have loved yet see no longer.

May God's Blessing be upon you.

WHAT DOES EASTER MEAN TO ME?

What a question... not easy... Easter time or Easter Day?

Easter time conjures up Spring and new birth; lambs and chicks; crocuses after snowdrops with primroses and daffodils to follow. More sunshine and longer daylight hours after the cold bleakness of winter and the promise of better days ahead when we can go out into the countryside to appreciate all the beauty around us. Everything comes alive again after its long months of slumber. Then of course there are Easter eggs, all the more delicious if you have given chocolate up for Lent!

The words “ Comes alive again” are the essence of Easter Day. We have the period of Lent when Jesus fasted in the wilderness for 40 days, tempted by the devil; his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday amid cheers of “Hosannah” followed by the jeers of “Crucify him” just five days later. His betrayal by one of his friends was truly awful but Jesus seemed to know what was to come.

When I was 12, I was convinced that no-one would inflict such horrific torture on another human being, but as we know, it is still going on today. On last night’s news, the city of Damascus was being shelled again with a tremendous loss of life. No-one spared. But on Easter Sunday, the most wonderful thing happened. The friends of Jesus who went to the tomb could not believe what they saw. “They have taken away my Lord” Mary of Magdala wailed. Later Mary thought Jesus was the gardener when she enquired about the body. Then he spoke to her and she knew who he was.

There were many doubters at that time and I am sure I would have been one of them, not believing until I had seen the proof of the wounds. Two thousand years later, we are still celebrating this greatest of miracles, with millions of people all over the world. The message is just as clear, if we believe in the resurrection and the promise of eternal life and that Jesus died to forgive our sins, we have nothing to worry about.

So, as we go out into the countryside and see everything coming to life again, we are reminded that Jesus was re-born and we can be too if we accept him into our hearts. This, I feel, is the true meaning of Easter.

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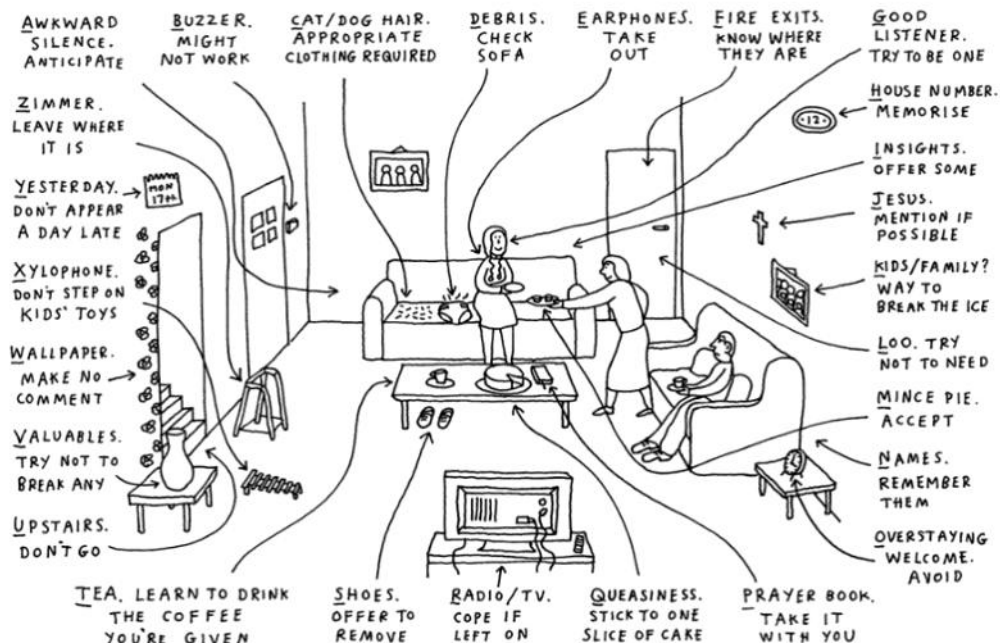

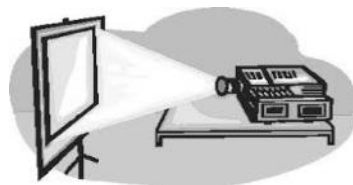
