# A Letter from your Vicar

As you read this letter you will probably be expecting me to say something about how well Christmas has gone. Unfortunately, at the point of writing this, Christmas is still two weeks away and I must admit that January is a bit difficult to think about right now.

However, there is one thing that I already have on my mind for the new year. It is my intention to run a course called "Journeys". As this course uses a video it will be held in St James Church so that we can use their screen and I hope to begin it on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> January, running for 5 weeks 7:00-8:30pm.

Journeys was produced as an evangelistic course, but it works a little differently from some other courses. It aims to help people to find and explore good questions rather than telling them what they should believe. I believe that if we can find the right questions then we are a long way towards finding the right answers, and that with prayer we can trust God to deal with the rest.

Having been involved in running this course previously I have found that it has helped me to understand my own faith in a deeper and more personal way. It has also (and this is the main reason for running it this time) helped me to put my own faith into words and therefore, it has been important in helping me to learn how to tell other people about my faith.

I am very keen to encourage everyone to tell people about Jesus. I believe that this is the greatest gift we can ever give to anyone and that it is at the core of what God is calling us to do as Christians. But I understand that telling people about Jesus, sharing your faith, is not something that comes naturally to everyone in fact the very idea of evangelism is out right scary to most of us. So, I hope that creating a safe space for us to begin to talk about Jesus together will be a way that this course might help you as it has helped me.

Why come to Journeys?

To find out about Jesus.

To explore and deepen your own personal faith.

To begin to learn how to put your faith into words.

I really hope you will be able to come along and join in with Journeys, and I pray that you will get a great deal out of it.



# **Testimony Time...**

### God honours children's faith... and teaches Dad a lesson.

This story goes back about 25 years, when we were a fairly broke young family. As a dad I loved sailing and still do. One year, I'd managed to scrape together enough money to hire a yacht to take our 3 eldest children, roughly aged 10, 8 and 6, sailing on the Norfolk Broads for 5 days.

By working hard and sailing all day, we hadn't the money to do anything else anyway, we had just enough time to sail down to Great Yarmouth. Then across Brayden water, a 5 mile long stretch that is the highlight of a Broads sailing holiday, before returning to the boatyard.

To do this you have to arrive at Great Yarmouth at low tide, then wait an hour of two for the tide to change and leave on a rising tide.

We were about 2 miles up stream approaching Great Yarmouth, when tacking the boat I got too close to the opposite bank and ran aground on a mud bank. As the tide is still falling with a bit a quick work, if you are lucky you have about 10 minutes to get the boat off. We unfortunately did not manage it, and were firmly stuck. Three very disappointed children were told "sorry we are stuck here for at least 5 hours, and this means we will not be able to cross Brayden water". My offer that we would settle down, get some sleep and then I would take them out in Great Yarmouth that night was a poor substitute.


The eldest firmly said "God can rescue us, lets pray". I responded "Listen, I fully believe God has the power to turn the tide around now and lift us off the mud bank. But I don't think He is going to change the tide times all the way up the east coast of England to sort out my stupid mistake". But we prayed, although with no faith on my part. I then instructed the kids to settle down. No sooner had we done this when a loud booming voice shouting, "Do you need some help?" got us out of our sleeping bags. By now we had been aground at least half an hour and were pretty well stuck.

We got up and saw that outside of the boat was a full size, sea going, fishing boat. No commercial traffic usually uses this river, but on this occasion they were going up it to recover a historic boat for restoration. Another 15 minutes and we would have been high and dry.

Within minutes we had three strong ropes on our boat, and their powerful engines pulled us easily backwards into deeper water.

"There you are Dad I told you God could do it if we just asked!!" The rest sail across Brayden water was wonderful!

### CHRISTMAS PRESENTS THAT I WISH I'D HAD

I think we can all remember presents we'd asked for but never got. Well my recollections are of Christmas presents I really wanted as a child, but never got. In fact the pillow case was a cornucopia of gifts, most of them what we'd asked for. I say we, because that's how it was with us. We had exactly the same gifts, no distinction even though my brother was 10 minutes older. Some presents we really desired at various stages of childhood, in our case were missing. Maybe Father Christmas was deaf. That's all it could be. It's a bit like the goal keeper. He will have made thousands of great saves but will always be remembered for the howlers he missed saving. I clearly remember decades on, the ones I wanted. The first book I really wanted was a Rupert Annual. He was a super star with his yellow striped trousers and red sweater and scarf; and he had such good friends. Alas he never appeared in the pillowcase. Maybe our address was not on his schedule

The next present I earnestly wanted was a particular football book. By this time I had personally confirmed that there was no Father Christmas by feigning sleep when mum and dad entered the bedroom and left the pillowcases at the foot of the beds. I heard them moving around and talking, dad following instructions as to the exact place to put them. Brother was sound asleep but I told him when he awoke. The book I wanted was one like my pals had for birthdays. A football book with big pictures inside of famous footballers and lots of action shots. What did we get?, A book on the history of football. Interesting, but, who at 10 years old wants to read about Clubs called Corinthian Casuals, Wanderers and Royal Engineers. Twenty to twenty five years ago, by chance I found the name of the book, a reprint and a compilation of Charles Buchan's Football Monthly, September 1951 to August 1971. I bought it and loved. My favourite footballer, full page inside, Tommy Lawton, plus all the stars of the 50's. Even as an adult it gave me pleasure reading it cover to cover.

The one we missed out on was having bikes, so we learned to ride by friends letting us have a go. In the hilly terrain of our part of the West Riding mum and dad considered it too dangerous. No matter how much we pleaded we couldn't budge them. Well, in life you don't always get what you want. It is one of life's lessons and we all get used to it.

Most of the things we asked for we received, a complete Hornby Train Set, which brought hours of enjoyment, dinky toys, books, football, punch ball and boxing gloves. (My ability with a football wasn't bad and the culmination of my career at 15 was to play at The Shay, home of Halifax Town, in a final of The Red Triangle League) Tommy Lawton's position was never under threat. I quickly threw the towel in at boxing, realising after a few punches with my brother that neither of us would become Bruce Woodcock.

Yearning for gifts recedes with age. However, now and again as you look round antique type shops your eyes alight on a toy, book or other item you had as a child. If there is something that is there that you missed out on, you get another chance and who could miss such an opportunity. Thank you Charles Buchan John Mitchell
