

A Letter from your Vicar

News from our PCC day (it was actually, quite good fun)

Our PCC recently met for an away day to consider "how we do things" and how we might work together better for the future. The day was a very positive one with lots of good-natured discussion and a genuine feeling of optimism about our future together. I feel it is important for me and all of us to thank our PCC members for their hard work and especially for their positive and faithful approach.

We were first caused to begin thinking about how we do things because of a number of what Archdeacon Ann called at our PCC meeting in May "irregularities" in our governance structure. However, at our PCC away day, our main motivation quickly became our recognition that practical challenges, such as maintaining buildings, generally dominate our meetings to such an extent that we find it hard to give our real priorities (prayer, worship, bible, etc) the attention that they deserve.

In the coming months we will be working closely with the diocese as we rethink how we do things and run the business of the parish. We will need to correct the irregularities, but we will make sure that our focus remains on ensuring that we are better able to focus more of our efforts on our real priorities; the mission of the Church to live out and share the Good News of the Gospel.

For many people the workings of our committees may seem to be a rather dull subject. For many, particularly those of you not directly involved in any of our committees, these changes may happen without even being noticed. But they are important because of there ability to either support our mission as a Church or become an obstacle to that same mission. And, it is important that everyone involved in our Churches be able to make their views known and heard.

Later in the year we will be providing opportunities for more people to hear about the details of what is being planned and to offer their views. In addition, any substantial changes will be presented to the whole parish for approval not later than our annual parochial Church meeting at the end of April next year. It is important to me that this is not done in a secretive way so, please ask myself or any of our PCC members if you would like to know more and we will be happy to discuss this with you.

I hope that you will all pray for our PCC, myself, and those involved from the diocese as we work to get these things right.

Helme Ladies Report May 2019

It's got to that time of the year when gardens are being made ready for the summer, so Helme Ladies decides to have a plant sale with lunch attached. The world famous Helme Pie Ladies were doing the lunch and Helme Ladies running the plant stall. Thank goodness the weather was fine and not like the day after when it rained all day. Tables were set and the plants displayed when the people started to arrive to take their seats for lunch, which consisted of vegetable soup, potato surprise and fruit crumble or rice pudding, all washed down with tea or coffee. Then it was time to look at the plants and decide which was needed for the garden. The raffle and sale added £80.40 to our Charity Fund with the lunch money going to Helme Pie Ladies who also donate to charity. We had had a busy day but also a very enjoyable one with lots of laughs.

It was time for Helme Ladies to receive another dose of culture as we went to see 'The Vicar of Dibley' in Marsden. The play was put on by the Marsden Parish Church Amateur Operatic and Dramatic Society but there was nothing amateurish about it, the actors looked so like their TV counterparts and sounded like them too. Hayley who played Alice the Verger had all the mannerisms at her fingertips, it was incredible. To say that we enjoyed ourselves is an understatement, there were lots of laughs too. I always think that you can't beat live theatre and sometimes the 'amateur' players can be better than the professionals because they are doing it for their own enjoyment. We came away with the feeling of when is the next play or musical going to be, bring it on.

We haven't done with all things cultural yet!! On May 21st we had a visit to the Colne Valley Museum. After a short talk by Susan Whitman about what there was for us to see, we were let loose to wander about. There was a Clog-maker's shop with all the tools and machinery that had come from Slaithwaite, and had been saved from a skip. The volunteers had a weekend to remove everything before the building was demolished. Cupboards, shelving, drawers, wooden soles and all the other bits for the Clogs were taken to the museum and displayed. We were shown how spinning had evolved from hand spinning with a spindle whorl to the Spinning Jenny. In the next room were two hand weaving looms which would have been used by a family in the days before the mills. The volunteers use the looms to weave cloth for sale in the shop. We also saw the living quarters of the family and in the kitchen and wash house were all the artefacts we remember from our youth. We finished our visit with tea/coffee and biscuits and a look around the shop. What a great morning we had had. If you haven't been to the Colne Valley Museum yet it is worth a visit.




