**'Lord I've been broken
although I'm not worthy you fixed me,
now I'm blinded by your grace
you came and saved me.'**

It may sound like a worship song, but these lines were sung to – and by – over 100,000 people at Glastonbury festival this summer.

Stormzy, a 25-year-old grime artist, played his two-part song 'Blinded By Your Grace' during an explosive 90-minute headline set at the UK's biggest music festival. He began his performance of 'Blinded By Your Grace pt. 2' by saying 'we're going to take this to church, and we're going to give God all the glory right now'. This was a change in tone from the rest of the rapper's performance, which consisted of stark political and anti-racist commentary with strong language throughout.

It was an unusual moment. An audience of over 100,000 were chanting their criticism of the current political status quo, but in the same performance, they were singing out a clear theology of grace: '

**'You saved this kid and I'm not your first
it's not by blood and it's not by birth
but oh my God what a God I serve.'**

Like so much of contemporary pop culture, Stormzy's performance at Glastonbury has divided Christians: those who immediately and unquestioningly celebrate such a clear declaration of gospel truth, even using his performance in church services; and those who write him off completely due to the bad language and questionable morals presented in the rest of his music. Although it may be difficult to reconcile the gospel message of 'Blinded By Your Grace' with the lyrics of his other songs, we should perhaps be wary of writing him off completely. But we also shouldn't accept and condone his music unthinkingly. As with so much in our culture, there is much to be affirmed and much to be critiqued here.

Whatever our conclusion, however, it is clear that this artist – the second youngest ever to headline Glastonbury, and the first ever black British solo artist to do so – has introduced the Christian concepts of grace, salvation, prayer, and brokenness to an audience who may otherwise never come across them.

We do not have to affirm everything about Stormzy's set and his music, but we can and should celebrate that – and pray that God would give the increase.

The Meltham Shoe Box Project Supporting Operation Christmas Child

The end of an era or the beginning of something new?


Meltham Shoe Box Project began operating in 2004. We were a small group of people from St James' Church who together with friends checked 400 boxes in 3 days. The following year we moved our November base to the Cross Roads Centre at Layne Dyke House and checked 13,181 boxes! Quite a leap, much activity, lots of help from the neighbouring firemen, all Meltham Churches and the Lions Club. We sought direction and support from Meltham Churches Together and the Crossroads Project who have prayerfully and financially supported us for the last 15 years. We then moved operations to St James' Church where the church family have quietly put up with us taking over the church for 4 weeks in November and using every bit of storage space they have! We have received 183,785 gift filled shoe boxes and packed them into 13,580 cartons for export!!

The theme of 'Love in a Box' a gift from one child to another was attractive to many individuals, schools, churches and organisations, those with faith and those with none. All that was needed was a desire to give. It gives folk the opportunity to share with a child overseas whom they will never know or see, but the donor can be reassured that the gift is highly valued by the recipient.

In recent times the American Evangelical influence on Samaritans Purse UK the parent charity of Operation Christmas Child has influenced the project to become Evangelical in the approach. 'The Greatest Gift', a bible study scheme for churches to use with children who receive boxes, has been interpreted by many to be one that draws children into Christianity. This is strongly denied by the charity but unfortunately the PR films mix the distribution of gift filled shoeboxes with the graduation of 'new' Christians who have come to know Jesus by the receiving of a gift filled box. Also, the increased suggested donation of £5 per box was impacted on the total boxes collected. The support of the head of Samaritans Purse, Franklin Graham, for President Trump and Mr Grahams speeches containing detrimental references against Muslim and gay people have been observed by many who no longer want to be associated with the charity. Governing bodies of schools and many churches have left the UK project because of the above. Almost 1 million shoe boxes were delivered to children from the UK in 2015, in comparison, 512,000 were collected last year. Samaritans Purse is one of the worlds leading disaster relief charities. It carries out amazing work with people of all race, colours and creeds when natural or other disasters strike.

The HQ of Operation Christmas Child has informed us that they are making structural changes to the UK organisation, following an American model which they assure us will work here in the UK. Last year a large Processing Centre opened in Birmingham, and the success of the team there is to be mirrored in 10 large regional units in the UK. Eventually all small warehouses, such as ours in Meltham, will no longer be needed. Initially we were told that the Meltham warehouse would be one of 30 operating this year. That is a reduction in the UK of 60 small local processing centres. After 2019 we would be no longer required as a warehouse. I have since had an email that says we can continue for the next 2 or 3 years whilst transition takes place to the 10 large Regional Centres.






Helme Ladies Report






