#### A letter from your vicar...

On Sunday the 10<sup>th</sup> of November we will have our remembrance service. Last year was the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Armistice Day and it was good to see so many people at the service. In the Church of England we always count how many people are at each of our services, but on this occasion I must admit that we had to make an estimate. Having so many people at a remembrance service that there were too many people to count is a good problem to have. We believe that there were over 450 people in Church, and I'm told that a few found they couldn't get in at all.

Having so many people did cause some confusion and perhaps a little chaos but, that was the centenary year. I have had a number of people tell me that there are not usually so many and that there won't be so many this year. I hope they are wrong.

Each year for the last 100 years a great many people have gathered in different places around the country to mark the armistice and Remembrance Sunday. We gather to remember:

We remember those who lost their lives in the first world war, and all those who have lost their lives serving our country in conflicts since then. We remember that war is a terrible thing but, that courage in standing against wrong ideologies is a good thing. We remember that too often those who have given their lives were far too young.

For many of us we gather for another reason as well, we gather to pray. Some of us who will gather on Remembrance Sunday pray often and some less often, some perhaps hardly at all. But as we gather, we pray with whatever faith we have, great or small, and we pray for peace. Not just peace for ourselves, but peace for all.

I know that world peace may seem a distant dream, and that praying for it may even be naive foolishness. However, my prayer is that as we gather and pray. We can all continue to share in hope; hope for a better and more peaceful future.

I believe hope should always be one of the reasons that we continue to remember.

#### REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 10th NOV ST BARTHOLOMEW'S CHURCH

This year we are doing something a bit different and need some more poppies, so if you could knit, crochet, or make some out of other materials we would be very grateful. Please let Gwynneth (07860636931) have them by **Friday 8**<sup>th</sup> **Nov.** 















If you have any problems with any of the techniques in the poppy patterns - and you have access to the internet - you will find lots of tutorial videos on youtube.

#### 1. Easy garter/knit stitch pattern for beginners

Colour A Red (one ball will make a lot of poppies!)
Colour B Scrap of Black or a black button

#### **Body of Poppy**

Using Col A cast on 120 stitches.

Rows 1-4 Knit

Row 5 Knit 3 stiches together across the row(40 stiches)

Rows 6-9Knit

Row 10 Knit 2 stitches together across the row(20 stitches)

Rows 11-14 Knit

Row 15 Knit 2 stitches together across the row(10 stitches)

Cut yarn leaving a tail of about 20cm

Thread tail through yarn needle and slip all the remaining live stitches onto the yarn tail and pull tight. Pull around into a circle and then mattress stitch (or use whatever stitching you normally use) to seam for an invisible seam. Sew in ends.

#### Centre of Poppy

Using B, cast on 16 sts. Cast off. Coil into a tight spiral and sew base to the centre. Or use a black or green button with 4 holes and sew to centre of poppy. Add pin.

#### 2.Two petal crochet poppy

Rnd 1: With 3mm hook and wool, ch2. Make 10dc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with a slst in 1st dc. (10sts)

Rnd 2: \*ch1 dc ch1 2tr in next st, 3tr in next st, 2tr ch1 dc in next st, slst in next 2sts. rep from \* once again.

Rnd 3: \*ch1 3dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next 5sts, 3dc in next 2 sts, slst in next 2sts. rep from \* once again. Fasten off.

Attach button in the centre. Add pin.

Stitch explanation

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

htr = half treble crochet

r = row

st(s) = stitch (es)

rep=repeat

rnd=round

slst = slip stitch

tr = treble crochet



#### The Meltham Shoe Box Project (MSBP)

The MSBP has supported the children's project Operation Christmas Child for the past 16 years. We have received and checked 200,000 gift filled shoe boxes which have travelled to many countries including Liberia, Belarus, Albania and Swaziland. We are a group of volunteers dedicated to the pastoral care of those involved and reaching children we will never meet, in countries we may never visit. We meet on Fridays at St James', Meltham Mills, from April until the end of October. We open the Processing Centre in November to process the donated boxes. We have around 200 volunteers who come and donate their valuable time. In 2020 we will begin to meet Friday 17 April.

We open for the delivery of filled shoe boxes from the 11th - 29th November, 10am - 5pm, Monday to Friday at St. James' Church, Huddersfield Road, Meltham Mills, HD9 4AL. There is a large car park adjacent to the church. We welcome volunteers to help check donated boxes, pack the sealed boxes into cartons and load the vans. Everyone receives an induction when they arrive. Refreshments and a light Lunch available.

#### What to put in a shoe Box for Operation Christmas Child.

You can pick up a leaflet which gives lots of information from the Crossroads Shop Meltham. Alternatively, you can go online at Samaritans purse.org.uk and click on Operation Christmas Child. Decide what sex and age you wish to give your box to. Boy or Girl ages 2-4, 5-9, 10-14. Find a shoe box – cover it in Christmas wrapping paper. No sweets or toothpaste please.

- Choose a toy, something to play with e.g. a ball, skipping rope, a doll or small car.
- 2. Something for school e.g. pencil case, notebook, calculator
- 3. Something warm e.g. hat, scarf, gloves
- 4. Toothbrush. Soap and flannel
- 5. A small cuddly toy.

Fill your box and fix a label to the top. Place a rubber band around the box. Make a donation towards the cost of transporting the box (suggestion £5) and place it in an envelope in the box. You can make your donation online and you will be sent a bar code to print and place in the box, see the Samaritans purse web site. **Take your box to The Crossroads Shop in Meltham or bring it to St. James' Church, Meltham Mills.** 

We are always in need of items to fill up the boxes we receive and you can leave these at the Crossroads shop in Meltham or bring them to St. James' Church. A financial contribution in place of a box will help us to get the boxes to their destination.

Support for the project comes from a variety of places. Individuals give their time to fill the boxes. Many schools, churches and businesses are involved. Schools take the opportunity to teach the children about sharing and giving to those less fortunate. Banks and building societies give staff a paid day away from work to come and help in the processing centre. Churches take the opportunity to share God's love by filling the boxes and informing their congregations about all aspects of Samaritans Purse and Operation Christmas Child. In Meltham we have tremendous support from the Crossroads Roads Shop and the grants committee. Tay Trans at Meltham Mills help with storing our filled cartons prior to export. Arrow van and car hire loan us a van at a very reasonable rate!! This is a community based project giving pleasure to all who donate, help and receive the boxes.


Dear All, We thought we'd give you an update on the lower graveyard.

The border with donated flowers is now well established. There is one border planted with teezels and bulbs and wildflower seeds, and another planted with teezels and bulbs which will be planted with pollinators next year. There is a small wildlife area where the nettles and brambles will be kept and a log pile is being built for bugs. A clover lawn will be planted next year. There is a new path and the gaps in the Berberis have been filled. Thank you to everyone who has supported the work in the lower graveyard. We were recently given lots of tulip bulbs by Martin Warriner who works with OCC. We have planted a large number in the graveyard and the rest are helping us to raise funds for 'Crisis'.

We hoped to maintain the graveyard without having to spray it all with weedkiller and we are delighted to say that this has been achieved. This is obviously better for the plants, the wildlife and also church finances. Lots of Buddleia have made a reappearance and with careful management they should encourage lots of butterflies. There have been times when we have wondered if we're a bit mad, but the more we read about creating a haven for wildlife (as well as making sure the graveyard looks cared for) the more it has felt to be a worthwhile project. A robin visits every time we're working and he always makes us smile.

We will probably need help again next year and we hope you will take a little time to have a look and see what is growing or visiting.
