Letter from your Vicar

September is a funny month; if you don't hit the ground running you will spend the month trying to catch up and be exhausted by October, if you do hit the ground running, all your plans will ensure you're exhausted by October. Either way around the summer holidays will feel like a long distant dream and people will start talking about Christmas coming soon.

For us, September has been busy and productive. We held our annual Civic Service at which we welcomed our new mayor, Ann, into her post and took the opportunity to thank all those who work hard to support our community as well as to pray for God's blessing on their work.

We have also started our Alpha course which will be running each Wednesday evening in the Church Hall until the end of November. This is being well attended and well supported.

We also held a public meeting to consider the future of Helme Church. It was very encouraging to have so many people attend and offer their support in trying to find a way to keep the building open and serving both the community and the Church. The next step will be to draw together a smaller group of people to consider the details and practicalities of how we might best manage the building in this respect. I am aware that maintaining access to the Churchyard is important to many people. It is the Church of England's theology to provide a permanent resting place. So I can reassure you all that ensuring that all graves are respected and remain accessible will be an important part of our planning.

I said that people are already talking about Christmas, and this will start on the weekend of the 29th/30th of November when we will have a Christmas fair in the Church Hall followed by the lights being turned on in the evening on the Saturday and Carols in the Park on Sunday evening.

Of course, before that we have the Harvest Festivals in October, the annual memorial service, and Remembrance Sunday. Our memorial service will be on the 2nd November at 4pm in St Bartholomew's and is open to anyone who wishes to remember a loved one. This year Remembrance Sunday is the 9th of November, and the service will start at 10:45am outside St

Bartholomew's. The Church will be open for those who need shelter or a seat.

The reality of the situation is that we have struggled for quite some time now to get enough voices together at the same time for various reasons, and we only now have one remaining man - that being our head boy and longest serving member Denis Armstong.

Conscious of the situation, the remaining choir members decided to meet socially to discuss the future of the choir. We met in the back room of the church hall and had a buffet tea then reminisced about the past and chatted about how we all feel currently. There was a consensus amongst most that it was not really feasible to continue as a choir and that we should now hang up our robes and officially draw down the curtain on this wonderful chapter of our history here at St Bartholomew's. Whilst this is a sad and reluctant decision, we felt that the time was right rather than to just let things drag on with no real purpose as they have for the past 12 months or so.

We do however have a lot to be thankful for; we've been very fortunate to be able to continue all these years with such a strong choir when many churches lost their choirs maybe more than 30 years ago. Much of this is down to the dedication and long service of individual members. On this subject, after digging through the choir musical diary which dates back to 1926, we were fortunate to find that the choir members had been listed in the January of each year. Looking back, we realised that Sue Gregory had clocked up 50 years singing in the choir. We presented Sue with a certificate, gift voucher, flowers and card. It was nice to mark the occasion and thank Sue for her years of dedication to the church and choir. Over the years we have had a few men who have reached milestone years of service, but we think Sue is the first lady to be recognised.

We feel that we would like to mark the occasion officially and we hope to sing together at the morning service on Advent Sunday (30th November) where as a church we can give thanks for the wonderful years of service from all choir members past and present, and hopefully sign off with some good Advent hymns. We hope that maybe some previous members will be able to join us for this also.

You never know though, we may have to dust off the vocal chords and turn out for the odd special occasion here and there. Denis A has already chosen his hymns and requested a 30 strong choir when the time eventually comes for his funeral! I'm not sure how we would muster up that many voices but we'd certainly do the best we can!

Alpha Course in Meltham Church Hall

It must have been a message of reassurance that the plan to hold an Alpha Course in the Church Hall was not a barmy idea! Sue and I were in the Basilica of St Trophime in Arles in September. And there on the church notice board was a poster advertising the Alpha Course!

The translated message was – "Try the Experience - A Time to meet, Question, Share, Meditate, Relax, Laugh, To discover."

And now the Alpha Course is underway, not only in Arles but in Meltham! And not just anywhere in Meltham – we are meeting in the newly refurbished Church Hall.

What happens? We gather, chat, have a meal together on tables of 8 or so, chat more watch a 25-minute video which provides the opportunity to chat more! The first video asks the question – "Is there more to life than this?" From the animated discussion on the first night, it was clear that the 32 participants were questioning, sharing their stories, meditating on what they had just watched, laughed and kept on talking.

Rev John encouraged everyone to have fun. Although deciding to go on this course is a serious undertaking, by and large, those present complied with his request.

Future topics include "Who is Jesus?" "Why did Jesus Die" "How can I have faith?" "Does God heal today?" and much more.

If you would like to sample one of the sessions, just come along on a Wednesday night at 6.30pm and see what you make of it. The Course runs until November 27th and the sessions last for about 2 hours.

Eco Church.

The Church of England has five missional priorities it is the fifth mark of mission that I am reflecting on today

To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth: This emphasizes the Church's responsibility towards environmental stewardship and caring for God's creation.

As a PCC in the summer, we discussed how we cared for creation and how we moved forward as a parish to think about how we did environmental stewardship in our churchyards and church buildings. The question was raised about what survey we could use to enable us to measure where we are and encourage us to move forward. The PCC took the decision to move forward with a programme that the diocese supports and which was set up by a Christian charity called A Rocha UK.

All four of the churches in our parish have now registered for eco church and begun the journey towards bronze. If you would like to know more about eco church please do take a look at the ecochurch website



Fused Glass Workshops

Hello everyone, I'm Carole Shoel, a fused and stained glass artist based in Meltham. From my home studio I create fused and stained glass, jewellery and art.

Two years ago, I was asked to run my first fused glass workshop. After some nudging and prompting I finally agreed and have to say it was a very enjoyable experience for all concerned. Working with fused glass is exciting because the raw materials are transformed into something really special in the kiln.

I hold fused glass workshops at Wilshaw Village Hall, a large light filled venue, accessible for those less mobile, with an adjacent car park.

This Autumn, besides holding fused glass Curve, Suncatcher and Christmas workshops, there are 2 Cross workshops taking place on October 9th and November 4th.

Suitable for adults of all ages, including those with less nimble fingers, the Cross shape will be hand cut and pre fused, ready for you to easily add your own creative and very personal decorations.

As there is less work to do in this workshop, decorating with beautiful glass elements will take less time than other workshops, approximately 1 hour, but there's plenty of time to finish if you take longer.

Come and meet new people and join in the fun! Make a floral or rainbow design, or something totally different. All materials, including specialist glass and equipment

are provided and I'm on hand to assist. At the end of the workshop your work will be whisked away to be kiln fired. It will be ready within 2 weeks.




